International Initiatives

○ Keio Summer Program (KSP)

A calendar to allow ease of participation by quarter-system students from North America was established, with an increase in the numbers of international students from non-partner institutions. A total of 443 students attended the course.



○ Short-term Study Abroad Program (inbound/outbound)

The Japanese Language and Culture Course for Fudan University scheduled from the end of January to February and the spring training program at Fudan University scheduled for March were cancelled due to the spread of COVID-19 (coronavirus disease) infections.

○ Programs and Degree Courses in English

27 Double Degree Programs were implemented, the largest number in Japan. Latest results data of 75 persons graduating or completing programs (at end of AY 2018; AY 2019 data forthcoming) .

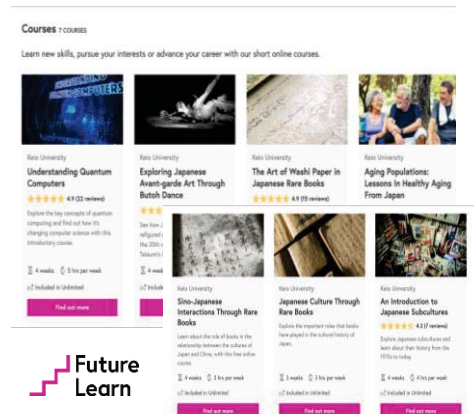
Academic Reforms

○ FutureLearn

FutureLearn is a free online educational platform which emphasizes Social Learning (studying together with fellow learners). In AY2019 Keio University offered a total of seven courses (increase of one course from previous year), with the number of participants registering for courses at 12,806.

○ Center for Global Interdisciplinary Courses

At the Center for Global Interdisciplinary Course (GIC), which is a platform for cultivating international and interdisciplinary human resources, more than 400 courses were held in English (as a foreign language) with a total of 1,602 persons taking the courses in AY 2019 (increase of 45 from previous year).



■ University-Specific Performance Indicators and Target Goals

○ World University Rankings

Ranked 91st in the world in the “THE University Impact Rankings 2019” which evaluates the societal contributions of universities against the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) index.

Three researchers (4,000 researchers selected from around 60 countries worldwide; 90 researchers selected from Japan) from Keio University were named among AY 2019 Highly Cited Researchers (HCR), which are selected annually by Clarivate Analytics (researchers producing a number of academic papers ranked in the top 1% by citations in 21 scientific fields).

○ Guest Professor (Global) through cross-appointment system

89 researchers from overseas were appointed as part of the global cross-appointment system. They participated in research guidance, thesis supervision, and education of graduate school students.

■ Enhancement of Global Presence and Reputation

○ Hosting of international conferences and events

On October 9, a lecture titled “Keio University and China” was given by Keio President Akira Haseyama at Nanjing Normal University. Around 200 persons, comprising mainly of graduate students, participated, and a lively question and answers session ensued.



On October 14, the 10th APRU Population Aging Conference (international conference on population aging) was jointly held with the Association of Pacific Rim Universities (APRU) sponsored by the World Health Organization (WHO), Ministry of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology (MEXT), and Ministry of Health, Labor and Welfare. Over 100 people, including early career researchers participated from universities in Japan and overseas with an emphasis on those in the Pacific Rim, with awards for outstanding papers, poster sessions, and panel discussions taking place. On November 23, the 9th edition of the Experience Japan Exhibition (Japan study abroad fair) was hosted in collaboration with the British Council. ■ Other Activities

○ Joining the U7+ Alliance

President Akira Haseyama participated in the U7 summit of university presidents held in conjunction with the G7 Paris Summit in July 2019. Keio University joined the U7+ Alliance, an international federation of universities which was newly established at the summit. This federation aims to instigate discussion on challenges with which the world is directly confronted such as climate change and societal disparities, and joint action such as policy recommendations to the G7, with more than 18 countries and 45 universities participating, with an emphasis on those from the G7 countries. Since the spread of COVID-19 infections, lively discussions have continued online on the role of universities from the respective countries.
